**New Directors**

The Nominating & Governance Committee recommends the nomination of three new members to the Board of Directors for three-year terms. They are:

**Hunter Brownlee (Stratham)**

Hunter Brownlee and his family started vacationing on Lake Wentworth more than nine years ago and they have returned each year to enjoy the fishing, sailing, and relaxing.

Hunter holds a BA in English with a minor in Art and Business Administration from the University of New Hampshire. He has been a financial advisor for more than 25 years and currently serves as a Registered Principal of the Impact Group with Vanderbilt Securities. There he oversees 13 advisors who concentrate on impact investing.

No stranger to the nonprofit world, Hunter served on the board of the Southeast Land Trust of NH for 11 years. He currently serves on their investment committee. He was a member of the Piscataqua Board of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation and also served on the finance committee to the main board. He presently serves on the Finance Committee of the Wentworth Watershed Association.
